HTML - Hyper Text Mark-up Language. This is a programming language used to create web pages. The idea of WCW, is that anyone with little or no web design knowledge can create a site. This can mean that the templates used within the site may be too restrictive for you to produce your own style for your pages. This is where a bit of HTML can help!

Inserting a Dividing Line using HTML:

To add a line to break up blocks of text, you could add the tag `<hr>`.

Example:

Adding a horizontal line`<hr>`

Will display as:

This tag can be used upon the following templates in the 'text' areas:

- Homepage
- Standard page
- Product/Directory/Picture page
- Document upload page
- Columns page
